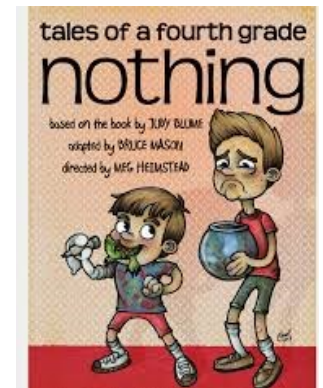
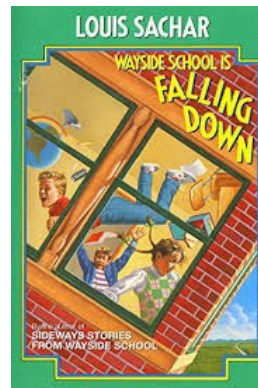
## Preschool
